1.1. Sponsorship of hunter classes in show schedules

The AHHA was established to help Show Societies all over Australia and to give hunter competitors a collective voice. As such the Association is keen to offer what support we can to show societies to help them improve the hunter classes in their programs and to attract hunter competitors to their shows.

We offer assistance by way of sponsorship of any hunter classes or (ideally) hunter rings that are included in show programs.

The amount of sponsorship that we offer to societies varies according to their needs and the number of classes they include in their programs. For example a show that has a dedicated hunter ring, with champions and supreme titles should expect to receive a greater amount of sponsorship.

Special consideration, however, is often given for shows who are including hunter classes in their programs for the first time as the AHHA is keen to reward such shows who are making real changes to develop the hunter classes in their programs.

Sponsorship may come in the form of prize money, prizes, ribbons, trophies and for larger shows or supreme titles garlands or rugs.

Please note that it is an essential requirement of sponsorship by the AHHA, (regardless of the size of the show) that one class is included in the program in each of the pony, galloway and horse height divisions for show hunters registered with the AHHA.

The process for applying for AHHA Show Sponsorship or Grading is as follows:

1. **Appoint a judge with demonstrable hunter experience.**

2. **Update the classes in your show program.**
When drafting show programs for sponsored shows, please note that the show hunter classes should ideally be set out in a similar manner to the sample programs included at Part 3 of this information pack. The minimum required classes for sponsorship are those included in the 'Basic' Show Hunter Program.
4. **Fill in the Show Sponsorship/ AHHA Show Grading Form** attached at the back of this information pack.

The application forms required when applying for sponsorship are contained at the back of this information pack. Please note that no sponsorship applications will be finalized unless a signed copy of the application form is received from the relevant show society.

1.2. Advice on your program/ class structure

For your information, we have included at Part 3, below, some examples of show and working hunter programs that you may like to include in your next show program.

1.3. Provision of a List of recognized show hunter judges (Australia and New Zealand)

The AHHA has compiled (and is constantly updating) a list of recognized and experienced show hunter judges available nationally. These judges are located in all states of Australia, as well as New Zealand and the United Kingdom and have been selected to be included on this list because they have demonstrated a specialized understanding of the hunter discipline.

2.1 An Essential Requirement

To prevent ‘double dipping’ or low quality hacks competing in hunter classes, it is imperative that competitors choose to compete either as a hack or as a hunter at any show. A good line to include in your program is as follows:

“Horses must either compete in the Show Hunter or Open ring, they may not compete in both.”

NB: This rule is an essential requirement of shows seeking sponsorship by the AHHA.

2.2 Providing adequate classes for your Hunter Competitors

The entry requirements for Royal shows across Australia now list the same number of required performances for hunters as they do for hacks. As such, shows should provide sufficient open hunter classes to allow hunter competitors to attend their show to achieve their performance requirements.

As a rule of thumb, shows should endeavour to put on the same number of classes for show hunters, as they do for show hacks. This includes making a second chance ring available for show hunters if it has been provided for show hacks.

In addition to ‘Open’ show hunter classes, shows should also include ‘Child’s’ and ‘Adults’ show hunter classes as these can also be used towards performances for Royal shows.

Most importantly, show societies should review their programs to ensure that there is more than one class available for a competitor of each height group to enter. Some shows in the past have confused having three classes - one for each of show hunter ponies, galloways and hacks - as providing three classes to competitors. In truth this only provides one class for any combination as, for example, a show hunter pony cannot compete in show hunter galloway class and vice versa.

Very few competitors will go to the trouble of washing, plaiting and transporting their horse for just one class. As such, including two or even three hunter classes for each height category gives competitors more incentive to come to your show and also means that you raise more revenue from classes. Many of the show societies that the AHHA has worked with, have seen a significant increase in the number of competitors in hunter classes once they have increased the number of classes available for exhibitors.

2.3 Experienced Hunter Judges = Happy competitors

It is important for show societies to get the judging correct for hunter classes, because in the past inconsistent judging at this level has caused widespread dissatisfaction and confusion within the hunter community. Common complaints are that judges who judge the hunter ring are not well versed in what is required of a hunter in respect of the workout, type, manners and movement etc.

The effect of poor judging on your show society is that competitors may not return in following years to your shows. You wouldn't choose a specialist arabian judge to judge quarterhorse classes and the same applies to hunter classes – a judge that has a strong understanding of hunter classes should always be given preference to one who only has experience, for example, in open hack, pony or thoroughbred rings.

In addition to this, it is always preferable to run a separate show hunter ring, rather than inserting show hunter classes into an existing hack ring, as this will allow you to select a judge to preside over all hunter classes who has specific experience judging hunter horses.

The AHHA has identified judges across Australia and New Zealand with specific experience judging and/or showing correct hunter typed horses and these are listed on our 'AHHA Judges List'.

2.4 Avoid Clashes in the Show Ring

Hunter rings are an excellent way for breeds such as warmbloods, welsh ponies, quarterhorses, dartmoor ponies etc. to have a chance to compete outside of the breed ring at agricultural shows. Savvy show societies will structure their programs to allow class times for these heavier breeds of horses to be run around the hunter ring as running both rings at the one time can lead to class clashes.

It should be noted also that welsh pony, riding pony and warmblood class wins can be used for show hunter performances for Sydney Royal, so it is always wise to ensure that these classes do not clash with show hunter classes if possible.

PART 4. INFORMATION ON WORKING HUNTER CLASSES

Working hunter classes are a great way to bring together the show jumping and show horse programs of agricultural schedules. It's also a great way for riders to show the versatility of their horses and their riding ability. Overseas these classes are considered to be very prestigious events and many Olympic level riders have emerged from the hunter discipline.

A working hunter class is comprised of the following phases:

- Jump;
- Flatwork; and
- Conformation.

While volunteers are needed to set up and pack up the jumps for working hunter classes and usually one person is required to stay around to lift fallen poles, if run correctly these classes can move along quite briskly, with limited delays and are a great draw for spectators.

The size and scale of the working hunter course can vary with each show's requirements. Some show societies use only two jumps, requiring competitors to jump each twice, while others include jump courses of up to 12 jumping efforts. Thus, working hunter classes are very adaptable to the resources of your show society.

Classes can be run according to horse height – ie: the heights of each jump course are set according to the height of the horses entering. For example:

Another approach however is to divide classes up as per jump height, allowing horses of all heights to enter each height division. The advantage of this is that it gives riders the ability to choose the class that best suits their horses ability (as not all hacks can comfortably jump 80cm and there are many ponies who can comfortably jump well above 50cm) and also gives riders the option to 'move through the grades' as they and their horse grow and develop their riding technique.

In such cases classes will be run with all heights of horses together, but for the awarding of prizes competitors are divided into pony/ galloway/ horse divisions to ensure that no advantage is given to any one height division. In such cases the classes will appear in programs as follows:

EXAMPLE OF A WORKING HUNTER PROGRAM BASED ON THE HEIGHT OF HORSES

1. Working Hunter Pony (ne 14hh) jumping maximum height of 55cm

 - Horse entered in Open Hack classes are not eligible to enter Working Hunter Classes
